5.I. Magistrate Court Building

Superior Court Judge, Dustin Hightower and Juvenile Court Judge, Tom Parmer presented the expenditure of \$108,415.29 to construct physical spaces to conduct drug testing and therapy in a portion of the building located at 166 Independence Drive, Carrollton, with the expenditures to be paid out of the Opioid Settlement funds and the work to be completed by Carroll County and other contractors, and to authorize the Chairman to sign all agreements and take all other necessary actions to carry out the project.

On a motion by District 3 Commissioner Tommy Lee and seconded by District 1 Commissioner Montrell McClendon, the Board of Commissioners voted unanimously to Approve.

5.II. Financial Recap for July 2024 (*no action item*)

Finance Director, Alecia Searcy, presented the Financial recap for July 2024 reporting revenue at \$3,470,434 and expenses at \$7,270,451.

5.III. Mental Health Advocates Restructuring

Lori Thomas, Program Director, Carroll County Early Diversion Program presented the restructuring of two (2) part-time positions to create one (1) full-time position using SAMHSA Grant funds to fund the creation of a full-time Peer Specialist position

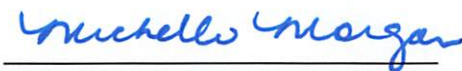
